## Continue Fine Record

Although many of the American troops who took part in the invasion of France had never had actual battle experience, at least

one division, the Ninth ,had made a fine record in Sicily before participating in the invasion of France.

A Dickinson county man, Sgt. B. A. Veltman, was with this division in Sicily and also in the spectacular dash across the Cherbourg pennsula, it has been learned. One group in Sergeant Veltman's outfit surprised the Germans so badly that they captured a squad of military policement who had just arrived at a crossroads to direct retreating traffic to the south.
